

## ANNUAL REPORT 2016-17

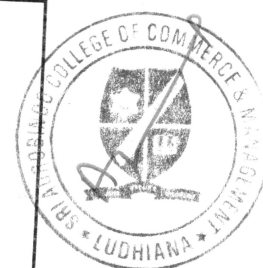

**MAINTAINING THE MOMENTUM:** Other activities of the college which were carried out during the current session also held the momentum of Integral Education:

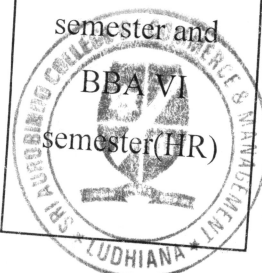
### **FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE:**

**SUPPLEMENTING TEACHING WITH PRACTICAL EXPOSURE THROUGH INDUSTRIAL/EDUCATIONAL VISITS:**

Industrial Visits have been incorporated as a part of SACCM's Curriculum and help the students in supplementing their theoretical knowledge with practical industry exposure. Various industrial visits were organized during the current academic session, the details of which are as follows:

**Vardhman Nisshinbo Garments:** Vardhman Nisshinbo Garments Limited is a joint venture between Vardhman Group and Japan-based Nisshinbo Textiles Inc. Forty seven students of B.Com 5<sup>th</sup> Semester got an opportunity to visit the unit on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2016. The objective was to get an overview of assembly line operations work, quality managements systems, productivity management of the unit etc. The officers guided the students about the various stages of formal shirt manufacturing like designing, cutting of fabric, sewing, finishing, quality control, packaging, etc. Students are studying Production and Operations Management in classroom, but here they got an opportunity to relate the theoretical concepts to the actual shop floor experience. They asked a number of quality questions regarding manufacturing which were satisfactorily answered by the officers.

**Annual General Meetings (AGMs) of various companies of Vardhman Group:** On 5<sup>th</sup> Sep'16, three AGMs of three different companies of Vardhman Group namely, Vardhman Textiles Ltd., Vardhman Acrylic Ltd. and Vardhman Holdings Ltd. were planned at different times. Students from B.Com and BBA third semester classes attended various meetings. The objective of this visit was to provide them an opportunity to see how the company law provisions studied by them in classroom are being followed practically, so that they could relate and hence better assimilate the concepts. Students of Company Law and Regulatory Framework of Companies had a practical experience as to how in reality the AGM of the company is conducted.

**Bansal Spinning mills:** Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce arranged an industrial visit for BBA students to Bansal Spinning Mills Limited, Sahnewal on 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2016. Main objective of the visit was to understand Human Resource Management systems and practices followed by a small scale company. As

many students, who belong to business class family, have business of small scale, the visit became relevant for them since they could take an overview of the level of systems and practices being followed, extent of professionalism observed, and various challenges particularly in manpower management faced by a small scale business. After seeing the production area, students had a discussion with Mr. Umesh Sharma, HR manager, Mr. S.M.Mishra, Quality Manager, and Mr. Chintan Bansal, Director of the company regarding various HR practices that the company followed.

**Panel Discussion by experts on BREXIT:** Students of Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management, Ludhiana visited the Panel discussion on BREXIT on 12<sup>th</sup> august, 2016 at University Business School, Panjab University Regional Centre, Ludhiana. The event was divided into two parts. Firstly, the students of UBS apprised the students as to what BREXIT has been and thereafter the four panelists namely, Mr. Mohan Ganesha, DGM SBI, Chandigarh, Dr. Harish Anand, Economic Advisor, Vardhman Group, Dr. Kulveen Trehan, Professor Indraprasth University, New Delhi and CA Amit Gupta, Director Taxation, Trident Group discussed the economic as well as worldwide geo – political implications of BREXIT with special reference to India. The students from various colleges had participated to attend the discussion. Various students raised their queries and the panelists entertained their queries to their satisfaction.

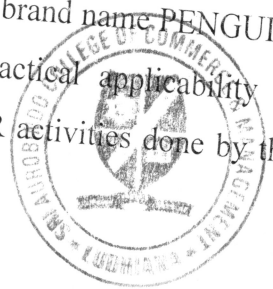
### **ICD Sahnewal, logistics B2B**

Sri aurobindo college of commerce and management organised an industrial visit as on 25<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2017 to ICD sahnwal; logistics B2B for 50 students of BBA 2<sup>nd</sup> and BBA 4<sup>th</sup> semester. Terminal manager Mr. Rana instructed the students regarding the layout of the place then consultant Mr. T.c.gupta along with custom officer Mr. Parmod lodhe guided the students how the stuffing of material is done for export, import & provided information for the items which are restricted , prohibited or free for export & they had given the presentation regarding export procedure; in which Mr. Amarjeet singh custom deputy commissioner; supritendent custom imports Mr. G.d. Bansal & Mr. Parshuram were present. They answered the queries asked by students. Students of international business & indirect tax laws relate their theoretical knowledge which they have been taught in the class with this practical eposure.

### **Madhur Knit Crafts Private Limited**

Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management organised an Industrial Visit to M/S Madhur Knit Crafts Private Limited.for the students of B.COM second semester. This company is owned by one of the alumni of SACCM Mr Piyush Gupta. The company manufacture blankets under the brand name PENGUIN. The visit helped the students to understand the manufacturing process and practical applicability of management theory. Students also got answers to their questions pertaining to CSR activities done by the organisation.

### **Vardhman Spinning and General Mills, Ludhiana**



SACM organized an industrial visit on 28 February 2017 to the Vardhman Spinning and General Mills for the students of B.Com Second Semester with a view to overcome the gap between theoretical and practical knowledge in the area of Indian Factories Act, 1948. A total of 57 students from Section A and 4 students from Section C visited the organisation and management of Indian Factories Act in the Vardhman Unit in detail. In the unit, visit was well organized by Ms Deepika, Head Industrial Relations (IR) of VSGM, Ludhiana. On arrival a comprehensive presentation was given to the students on PowerPoint explaining the details of Various Section and Schedules of Indian Factories Act, 1948 like Health, Safety and Welfare provisions, appointment of Adult, Women and Young persons. The students were also apprised about the statutory norms followed by the VSGM unit in day to day working inside the unit. The students visited various sections of the unit like payment of wages, training center, creches, rest rooms, cotton openers and employment of women and adults in the factory. In addition to this the provisions of Health like cleanliness and disposal of wastes were observed by the students.

### STARTUP WEEKEND

Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management in association with Incube Accelerators organized the first Startup Weekend at Ludhiana. The mega three-day event was organised for entrepreneurs and students to meet and interact share their ideas and help launch new businesses. Event was open to anyone with a great idea, and the desire to convert that idea into reality. It has a mission to create Startups, convert Job Seekers into Job Creators, creating newer ways to eradicate problems like unemployment and underemployment and also to retain the talent of the city within the city of Ludhiana. A total of 47 business ideas were presented during the pitches. Out of these, best 10 business ideas were selected. Then the participants whose ideas were selected were asked to make teams. The teams demonstrated their Products and Business Models and received valuable feedback from a panel of jury members comprising of Mr Kamal Wadhwa, Founder TCY, Mr. Sumeer Walia, Director for Entrepreneurship and Education Development (CEED), Chitkara University and Mr Akshay Ahuja, Founder RoboChamps.

#### **INDEPENDENT THINKING EXERCISE**

Thinking independently is a virtue which creates an independent identity of a person. Our college is responsibly putting best of its efforts to holistically develop and constructively channelize the energy of students. To enable students in having independent opinion about various economic, political, social and ethical issues, Independent thinking exercise is carried out by the college. Independent thinking exercise is aimed at enabling the students to make and trust their own judgment instead of just depending on others' opinions and judgment; even if they contradict to what others say. This in no means indicate that students should become adamant and not remain open but they should develop the capacity to analyze the issue from different perspectives and then make up their mind. This exercise intellectually stimulates the students and they develop a rational approach to form an opinion on various issues. During the current year, a preliminary round and subsequent five sessions of the exercise were organized. The preliminary round was conducted on 14<sup>th</sup> September, 2016 on the topic 'Values: do they change with time or are they eternal?'. #### LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

As being done in the past, college is constantly improving the library in terms of its rich collection and its operations facilitating its usage. Presently, the total numbers of books in the library are 4452. Number of good reference books has been added to enrich the library collection. Library subscribed 8 newspapers, 26 journals and 3 magazines included journals of reputed publishers and management institutions like Sage, Springer and MDI. Moving in the direction of automation, college also has Web OPAC for searching the books in the library and their issuance status. An e-resource named "N-List" having vast collection of more than 30,00,000 e-books and more than 6,000 e-journals. One photocopier-printer-scanner is provided in the library for the students. College also has a separate reading room and total seating capacity of library and reading room is more than 100. Library also has an institutional repository having research papers of faculty, students' project reports, old question papers etc.

#### MODEL UNITED NATIONS (MUN)



Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management organized its first ever Intra - College Model United Nations Conference on August 20-21, 2016. 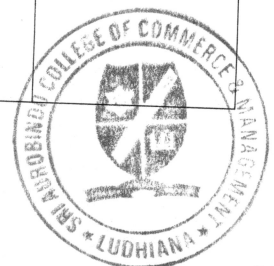
### INTER COLLEGE MODEL UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCES

Model United Nations or MUN is an educational simulation of the United Nations where students assume the roles of diplomats and engage in debate on pertinent topics. Students get an opportunity to learn about diplomacy, international relations, and the United Nations. It involves researching, public speaking, debating and writing skills and above all critical thinking. Participants in MUN conferences, known as delegates, are placed in committees and assigned countries, or occasionally other organizations or political figures, where they represent members of that body. They are presented with their assignments in advance, along with a topic or topics that their committee will discuss. Delegates conduct research before conferences and formulate positions that they will then debate with their fellow delegates in the committee, staying true to the actual position of the member they represent. First lecture was delivered by Padma Bhushan Sh.S.P.Oswal, Chairman, Vardhman group of companies, who gave inputs on the real meaning of education as advocated by Sri Aurobindo. This session was further followed by two more sessions chaired by Mr. Pulkit Sharma, a Clinical Psychologist and a Psychotherapist, who interacted with the students on two different themes "Who am I?" and "How to combat stress?". During his first session, Mr. Pulkit Sharma, very professionally, revisited the path of Integral Yoga, developed by Sri Aurobindo and The Mother to discover one's true self and evolve further. In the second session, he suggested that introspection to understand oneself, meditation to acquire calmness, and positive thinking to shun negative thoughts are some of the ways to combat stress.

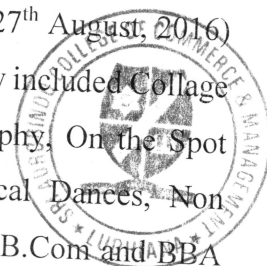
### **PSYCHOLOGICAL INTERVENTION**

Counseling is a professional relationship between a counselor and client, which helps client to identify source of difficulties or concerns he/she is experiencing. Problems can be in personal and interpersonal functioning across the life span with a focus on emotional, social, vocational, educational, health related, developmental and organizational concerns. Together they develop ways to deal with and overcome this problem so that person has new skills and increased understanding of themselves and others. An endeavor in this direction was made by the College by engaging full time psychologist for the students who find difficulty in managing their personal and college life. Several individual and group counseling sessions were planned for such students by the Psychologist in the College.

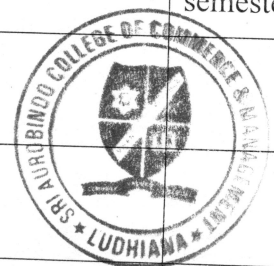
### **SACCM HOSTS A CULTURAL EXTRAVAGANZA AT 'MANTHAN- 2016'**

### Parwaaz 2017 by UBS, Ludhiana

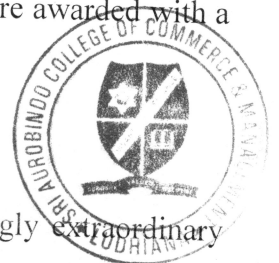

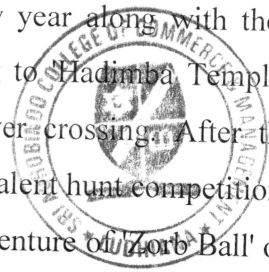
### **EDUCATIONAL CUM EXCURSION TRIPS:**

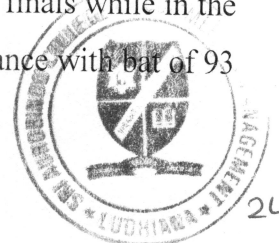

**FAREWELL PARTY**

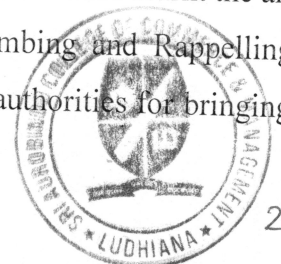
